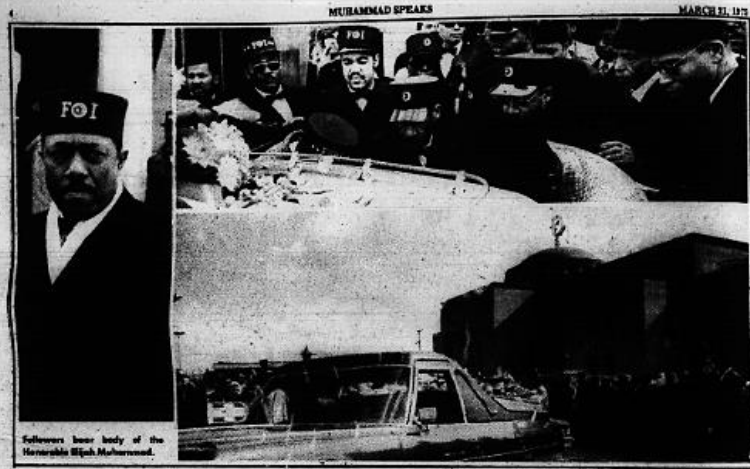

## Shrine for Messenger's remains

**CHICAGO —** The casket with the remains of the Honorable Elijah Muhammad, the Last Messenger of Allah — May the Peace and Blessings of Allah forever be upon Him — is now at rest at Muhammad's Holy Temple of Islam, No. 2, and will remain so until a Memorial Mausoleum can be built for His permanent enshrinement.

**THE REMAINS** of the Messenger had originally been placed in the Mt. Glenwood Cemetery in Thornton, Ill., next to that of His wife, the late Sister Clara Muhammad pending the granting of a permit by the City of Chicago for entombment at Temple No. 2.

The casket of the Messenger of Allah has been brought to rest in a private room at Temple No. 2, and will be available for viewing in the near future.
