At the University of Khartoum, Sudan, where I resided at the girls' hostel, the calendar year is from July, through March. The months of April, May, and June are too hot for classes to be held, and the final examinations are held around the end of February.

JANUARY IS THE month that the university students really begin concentrated study. For unlike the American system of examination, where exams are held periodically, (once every two weeks, or every month, and often every week) only one exam, the final exam is given to determine whether or not a student passes or fails the course.

Every morning before the first class (7:00 or 8:00) and every afternoon after tea (4:30) the female residents of the hostel met in little groups to review the studies of their courses. Four or five girls would comprise one group. They often sat together on the lawns within the Hostel walls. One would always begin by reciting the complete outline of a course.

After the outline of the complete course, another girl would elaborate on the first point of the outline and all of the group members would contribute facts, comments, etc. until that subject had been exhausted. If there was anyone in the group who did not understand any part of that discussed, the other members of the group would continue to review with that one until she understood. This was unity, true sisterhood.

These Sudanese Muslim girls did not stay with the same group of sisters morning and afternoon but they changed and alternated and sat with other girls who were taking the same course of study.

THESE WERE pleasant study groups, where one does not feel any selfish or envious sentiments spreading among the sisters. This
