

THE TELEPHONE rang and when the man of the house answered, he was told that General Abboud, the head of state, had just announced over the radio his resignation. We knew then that the shouting was of joy and victory, not of a riot, or a demonstration.

> Then we reached the medical faculty which is at the opposite end of the street of the palace. The crowd was thick and many of them were coming away from the palace, so we returned to our respective homes rather than push on to the palace,

> It was good that we did not go on to the palace for the guards outside of the palace fired on the approaching crowd. Many were seriously wounded, some even killed. The guards had not heard the announcement on the radio. nor had they any orders other than to protect the palace and the grounds of the palace. I was told later that a few young lieutenants had put a gun to General Abbouds's head and forced him to make the statement of his resignation over the radio.

THE GOVERNMENT did resign however soon after this inci-
