The great fathers of all nations and of all peoples who slept are now the inheritors of a fortune that is as wide as the earth is wide and is as full as the universe itself.

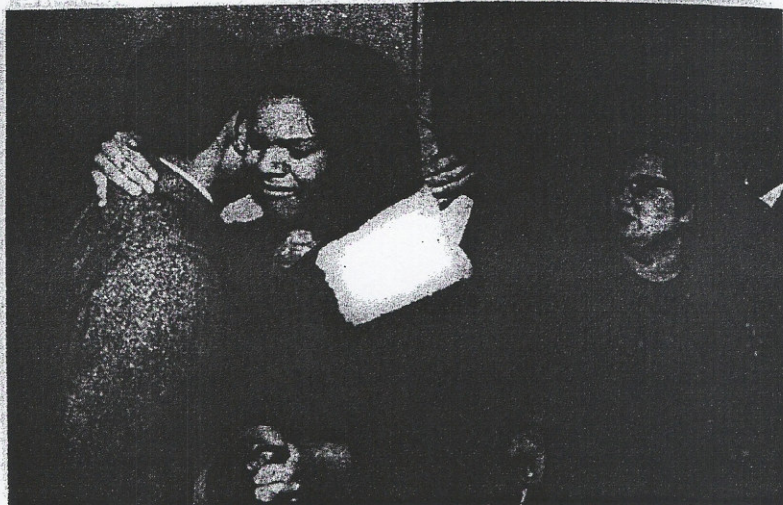
Tanzanians Send Food to Guinea on Chinese Ship

DAR ES SALAAM — A shipment of Maize and rice from Tanzania to Guinea left here aboard a Chinese freighter in a growing kinship of worldwide nations cooperating against Western economic exploitation.

THE 10,200 TONS of foodstuffs left aboard the Chinese ocean-going freighter Youhao (Friendship) accompanied by Chinese Ambassador to Tanzania Ho Ying. He was seen off by Tanzanian second vice-president Kawawa.

The Chinese freighter came at the request of the Tanzanian government to ship the maize and rice sent as a gift to Guinea by the nation.

Guinea has suffered under the sudden withdrawal of U.S. aid following an incident in which Guinea accused the U.S. of engineering a plot in which a number of Guinean diplomats were kidnapped in Ghana while en route to an Organization of African Unity conference.

Heart Aid's 1st Use in 1966

After a decade or more of animal experimentation with mechanical hearts, medicine made a first step toward human use in 1966.

MECHANICAL devices to aid a failing left ventricle of the heart were implanted in the chests of patients at medical centers in Houston, Texas, and Brooklyn, N.Y.

In neither case was the device an "artificial heart," but may be regarded as a step in the development of a complete mechanical heart. The stated purpose of both the Brooklyn and Houston "ventricles" is to replace left ventricular function

temporarily, until the patient's heart recovers sufficient function to act without assistance.

As of late autumn only one of the extremely ill patients in whom the devices were used has survived. A Mexican woman, a patient in Houston, was released from the hospital after her heart recovered sufficient function to permit removal of the ventricular aid.
