Undercover man with Malcolm

GOVERNMENT AND POLICE agents are known to have infiltrated countless Black organizations, hoping that their highly advanced electronic devices can catch some unwise person talking about his or her fantasies of military terrorism.

The New York 21 trial has exposed a Black undercover agent, Gene Roberts, whose testimony and recordings of Black youths talking about 'taking Central Park' during a revolution is being used by the prosecution in an attempt to convict 21 Black youths for no other crime than 'loose talk', though the charge is conspiring to bomb public places.

Even more interesting, considering the divisiveness in the Black community caused by white people's and Black agents' description of the death of Malcolm Little, Detective Roberts — the one who infiltrated the Black Panther Party — was one of Malcolm's "bodyguards" during the Harlem shoot-out that took Malcolm's life.

The white press used the well-planned killing to slander The Honorable Elijah Muhammad and crush the Nation of Islam. Like the Bay of Pigs invasion, however, this plot has had effects opposite to what white leaders had planned.
